Sacred Music Notes

Josef Rheinberger's reputation as a composer today is largely based on his twenty organ sonatas in twenty keys, creating "the most valuable addition to organ music since the time of Mendelssohn" (Nicholl). Yet, during his lifetime, he was much more than just an organist-composer. He was one of the most sought after teachers for composition, as well as a highly accomplished conductor. Regarded as a local prodigy, he became the organist at the Church of St. Florian in Vaduz at the age of seven. His Mass for three voices and organ was performed around his eighth birthday. Brahms' study of the last movement of Rheinberger's Organ Sonata No. 8 (Introduction and Passacaglia) influenced his use of the form for the final movement of his fourth symphony. The theme of the passacaglia, presented in the pedals, is followed by twenty-four variations. It has become an examination piece and a staple in the repertoire.

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
