



Dear Cathedral and St. Mary Mission Families,

This Sunday we enter the beautiful liturgical Season of Advent. From the Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year, we read: "Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight." Our hearts can be quieted to watch and listen for the coming of our Lord in our daily lives...

The Blessed Virgin Mary is so much at the center of this mercy! God bless you with a fruitful Advent! Advent waiting and watching as she was the first to welcome Jesus' coming within her by the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit upon her. We have

two Marian liturgies in this time: on Dec. 8th we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary's Immaculate Conception and on Dec. 12th the Feast Of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This year the Mass for Our Lady of Guadalupe at 5:30 p.m. will be largely in Spanish, offered by Bishop John, and welcoming anyone to join with him. For the Immaculate Conception, there will be a 5:15 p.m. Vigil Mass on Dec. 7th and Masses at 8:00 a.m, 12:10 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. at the Cathedral and a Mass at 5:30 p.m. on Dec. 8 at St. Mary's.
