

A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean."



#### Lent: Pray, Fasting, and Almsgiving

Lent is fast approaching. Are you prepared for this penitential season? The season where we are called to purify ourselves of the harmful effects of sin so that we may live in the freedom of Christ. What are the effects of sin, you ask?

- \* The first effect caused by sin is a broken relationship with God. This relationship is first renewed and fixed by Christ in confession, but strengthened by prayer.
- \* The second broken relationship is with our own self. This can be renewed in Christ by fasting. Fasting reminds us that our trust needs to be in God alone.
- \* The third is a broken relationship with others. This is renewed by Christ in our action of almsgiving; which is just practicing the virtue of generosity by faithfully giving of oneself in time, talent, gift or aiding another towards the Cross of Christ.

During the season of Lent we are called to do all three; pray, fasting, and almsgiving depending on our ability. (pregnant women, children under age 14, adults 59 & older, or anyone struggling with an eating disorder are not required to fast)

Keep it simple, start with small faithful actions which are realistic and up building to your relationship with God.

- \* Set aside 15 minutes of prayer
- \* Try journaling- telling God one good moment of the day, one struggle, or how you feel.
- \* Instead of TV replace it with a video on FORMED
- Try praying the rosary or a chaplet daily.

The important thing to remember is: if you fall off the horse, just get back on. Messing up one day doesn't mean Lent was a bust, don't give up. We all struggle and its okay, as long as you keep trying. God knows your heart.


Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that together do not add up to a single full meal.
