



# From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Cathedral and St. Mary Mission families,

This weekend we celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Lent, entering into the last two weeks of Lent. I hope you have been finding time for prayer, maybe some extra Masses during the week, time for a healing Confession, and some good reading to encourage you..

This Monday, Mar. 18<sup>th</sup> St. Michael Parish will have their Penance Service at 7 p.m. and on Tuesday, Mar. 19<sup>th</sup> our Cathedral Penance Service will be at 7 p.m. Come and let the Lord renew you!

The <u>Spring Study Day</u> on Thursday, March 21<sup>st</sup> should be very good – I've gotten to know the presenter, Fr. Luke Ferris, through our serving together on a program for priests put on by the Institute for Priestly Formation (IPF) He is a priest

of the Diocese of Green Bay and a fine preacher and teacher.

Following the Study Day we will celebrate the <a href="Chrism Mass">Chrism Mass</a> during which the Bishop will bless the Oil of the Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick, and the Sacred Chrism. A portion of these Holy Oils will be given to each parish and mission in the Diocese for use in the Sacraments. The Oil of Catechumens is used in Baptism, the Oil of the Sick is used in the Sacrament of Anointing, and the Sacred Chrism is used in Baptism, Confirmation, and the Sacrament of Holy Orders when a priest's hands are anointed and when a Bishop's head is anointed. This has roots in the Old Testament where we see anointing's of Priests, Prophets, and Kings of Israel. 'Christ' means "The Anointed" and we call Jesus <a href="Christ">Christ' means</a> "The Anointed" and King.

#### The Fifth Sunday of Lent

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to him saying, "Master, the one you love is ill."

When Jesus heard this he said,
"This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of
God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."
Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.
So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in
the place where he was. Then after this he said to his
disciples, "Let us go back to Judea."
The disciples said to him,

"Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?"

Jesus answered,

"Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light

of this world.

But if one walks at night,
he stumbles, because the light
is not in him." He said this,
and then told them,

"Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him."

## Tree of Life **Chrism Mass** "Priest, Prophet, King"



In the Old Testament there were three types of people who were anointed.

- Priests "And he poured some of the anointing oil on Aaron's head and anointed him to consecrate him." (Leviticus 8:12)
- ◆ Prophets "and the LORD said to [Elijah] "... and Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah you shall anoint to be prophet in your place." (1 Kings 19:15-17)
- ♦ Kings "Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers. And the Spirit of the LORD rushed upon David from that day forward." (1 Samuel 16:13)

No matter what our proper vocation is whether it be priesthood, marriage or religious life we are all called to live as a priest, prophet and king in our vocation. When we offer up our sacrifices we live out our priesthood. When we proclaim the Word of God we live like a prophet. When we undertake spiritual and corporal works of mercy we live out our kingly mission. The grace to sacrifice, to proclaim, and to undertake works of mercy come from being anointed in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. This Mass happens once a year in every diocesan Cathedral. The diocese is called together to give praise for the lifegiving grace of being an anointed son or daughter of God.

Now even more beautiful is that this olive oil is connected to Jesus. After the Passover (Last Supper) Jesus goes to the Mount of Olives (the Garden of Gethsemane). Why is this important? Remember the two trees in the Garden of Eden? The tree of the knowledge of good and evil and the tree of life. In Jewish tradition the Tree of Life was an olive tree. For Jesus's Passion to start on the Mount of Olives shows that we should be looking for the Tree of Life, which we as Catholics know, is the Cross where God sacrifices Himself for us. Talk about a perfect High Priest, the perfect Prophet of Mercy, and the perfect King of Grace for all. This is what we celebrate at the Chrism Mass.

Please consider joining all the priests of the Diocese who are renewing their sacramental graces of the priesthood by renewing the graces of the sacraments you have received in your life, the gift of Jesus Christ, Himself, who is the One and Only Tree of Life. It will be this Thursday, March 21st at St. Peter Cathedral, 3:30PM.
