

## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Cathedral and St. Mary Mission Families,

This Sunday we celebrate as <u>Divine Mercy Sunday</u>, a Feast which our Lord spoke of desiring in His messages to St. Faustina:

"It is my desire that this "Feast of Mercy" be Solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter... I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open... I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy..."

It was Pope St. John Paul II who established this Sunday formally as Divine Mercy Sunday when he canonized St. Faustina. He had a special role in encouraging St. Faustina's diary to be reviewed by the Vatican, resulting in an approval of its doctrinal integrity after it had been questioned because of some mistranslation years earlier.

We will have a number of priests to celebrate the Sacrament of Confession starting at about 2:30 p.m. for about a half hour. Then we will have the image of Divine Mercy blessed and we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. There will be Benediction after a Reflection and Adoration, and then more Confession will be offered for a time. Thank you to all who have been organizing this event and for all priests who will be helping.

With our Holy Father calling for this year to be a Year of Prayer, I especially encourage you to take part in the faith enrichment series "Living a Discerning Life" that will start on Wed., April 10 at 7 p.m. in the Media Room. There will be ten episodes featuring Fr. Timothy Gallagher, who is an expert in this – just sign up on the bulletin board or call our Office. God bless you and yours!

### Divine Mercy Sunday



On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his

side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them,

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him,

"Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this

other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
