11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said.

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."



With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand

Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

Come, visit and grow in relationship with our Eucharistic Lord in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel! The adoration tabernacle in the chapel allows one to adore our Lord at any time (24/7) and for any length of time they desire. If you are at the end of your time of adoration and no other adorer is present, you may leave the chapel after closing the small

doors on the adoration tabernacle. Simple guidelines are in the chapel. Anyone can adore our Lord as they desire.

There are, however, also many reasons one may wish to commit to adoration for a specific hour each week.

- With our hectic lives, it is easy to put adoration aside because it is so flexible. "I can go later" or "anytime." Sometimes before we know it, we have not visited with our Lord for an extended period. A holy hour commitment can remind us how important it is to come before our Lord every week, making Him a priority in our lives.
- There is also a beautiful and powerful witness in seeing someone before the Blessed Sacrament in love and prayer more frequently or even perpetually.




