

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, ' Talitha koum, " which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

This position will teach courses, such as math, science, reading, writing, spelling, language arts, social studies and religion.





Notes from VENERABLE FREDERIC BARAGA First Bishop of Marquette



Although far from the battlefront, Baraga's diocese was affected by the Civil War. The rising prices of commodities, decreased purchasing power of the dollar and many of the able-bodied men had left to join the colors; some of them retuned home maimed. Donations were fewer and smaller than before and his needs were greater.


