

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings and Salutations!

Happy 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time! In the Gospel for this Sunday from Luke 12:13-21, we encounter the Parable of the Rich Fool. The bottom line is that money and things are needed in order to live dignified lives.

However, money and possessions are only a means to an end, not the goal itself. They are useful and good insofar they are an aid to our relationship with God, the Church, our family, our friends, provide for our own needs, etc. So, if striving after them makes us neglect a healthy relationship with God, the Church, and our neighbors, proper love of self, then we have a serious problem. The Lord knows that the temptation to seek money, fame, and fortune is a strong one, and that's why he makes this lesson clear: "Take care to guard against all greed," he warns. Instead, strive to be "rich in what matters to God."

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me."

He replied to him,

"Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?"

Then he said to the crowd,

"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Then he told them a parable.

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?'"

And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones.

There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"'

But God said to him,

'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?'

Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

Both the choir loft and belltower projects are underway. The Grateful for God's Mercies (GFGM) capital campaign is projected to raise nearly \$1.5 million. 





St. Mary Mission History:

Prior to 1906 the Northern Lumber Co. purchased land just west of Saux Head on Highway 550 and began operations in hardwood lumbering. The woodsmen and their families moved to the area named Birch. A general store, machine shops, barns, boarding house, streets, alleys and comfortable little houses were laid out and built to serve the population of 300. Within a year, Birch was described as a booming little lumber town. Many of these inhabitants were Catholics and on July 17, 1906, the first recordings were handwritten by Father J. A. Sauriol in a small Baptismal Record Book of Birch and Big Bay Mission. On the first page we read the following:

Mission of Birch opened with the sanction of the Rt. Rev. Bishop Eis on demand from Rev. J. A. Sauriol, 17th day of July 1906. To be continued....




