FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings and Salutations!

Happy 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time! This Sunday we encounter the famous Gospel passage from Luke 10: 38-42, the episode of Jesus in the house of Martha and Mary.

It presents two responses to the Lord. Mary sits at the feet of the Lord Jesus listening to him and receiving his wisdom, while Martha keeps busy offering hospitality in a posture of active service. The Lord rebukes Martha because she is distracted and anxious. It is good that she serves, but not good that she is being pulled away from what is most important by her amped up feelings of worry. He reminds Martha that one thing is necessary. It's a challenge for all of us to keep our attention on what is important in the midst of active lives. When we find ourselves distracted and anxious, this Gospel encourages us to gently turn our gaze back to the Lord and seek to learn from him, and to follow him where he leads. We all need to spend ample time in silent prayer, then serve God and neighbor.

Origen of Alexandria (d. 253 A.D.) comments on this passage: "You might reasonably take Martha to stand for action and Mary for contemplation. For the mystery of love is lost to the active life unless one directs his teaching, and his exhortation

to action, toward contemplation. For, there is no action without contemplation, or contemplation without action." (Origen, *Fragments on the Gospel of Luke*).

Both the choir loft and belltower projects are underway. The Grateful for God's Mercies (GFGM) capital campaign is projected to raise nearly \$1.5 million. The funds have provided our Cathedral with an updated sanctuary and new tabernacle, new boilers, roof repair for the Baraga chapel, AC for the parish office, and partially paid for the sewer pipe repair and north rectory basement wall waterproofing. Thank you for your generosity and for following through with your pledges in support of this important and necessary work. 
DEVOTIONS, *Explained*

St. Bridget Prayers

St. Bridget of Sweden (d. 1373) was a noblewoman of the Middle Ages whose renowned mysticism centered on the passion of Christ. A mother of eight and an attendant at the royal court in Sweden, as a widow she founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior, advocated for reform in the church and for the return of the Pope to Rome from France.

The St. Bridget Prayers refer to 15 prayers attributed to Bridget which evoke the imagery of Christ's suffering and death, plead for the forgiveness of the supplicant's sins, for a happy death, for fear and love of the Lord, and for a renunciation of worldly desires.

For years, these prayers were associated with divine promises, though in 1954 the Catholic Church declared that it could not be said that these promises were of supernatural origin. The prayers themselves remain beloved and popular devotions to Christ's passion.






