FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings and Salutations!

Happy 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time! In the second reading for this Sunday from Hebrews 12, the author speaks about the discipline of the Lord. Through the ages, the role of the father has been to discipline his sons and daughters; and he does this because he loves

them. The father disciplines the child in order to drive foolishness out of him and to instruct him. The reticence to discipline children in western society is a rather recent phenomenon. It wasn't that long ago that parents, family members, neighbors, teachers, pastors, sisters—everyone—worked together to train our young people to grow up into men and women of character. In terms of our relationship with God, the fact that you're being disciplined by God shows not only that he loves you, but that you're a legitimate son or daughter of God, that you're his child, because a father disciplines those children he loves.

Pope Francis offered some wise words on a father disciplining his children. "A good father knows how to wait and knows how to forgive from the depths of his heart. Certainly, he also knows how to correct with firmness: he is not a weak father, submissive and sentimental. The father who knows how to correct without humiliating is the one who knows how to protect without sparing himself. Once I heard a father at a meeting on marriage say: 'Sometimes I have to strike the

children lightly...but never in the face so as not to humiliate them.' How beautiful! He has a sense of dignity. He must punish, but he does it in a just way and moves on (Pope Francis, General Audience, 4 February, 2015)."

The reason the air conditioning hasn't been on is that the 100-ton chiller catastrophically failed. The HVAC engineer from our insurance company recently concluded that a lightning strike caused the damage. The cost to replace the chiller is estimated to be in the range of \$145,000-\$150,000. Our insurance will cover roughly 76% of the replacement cost, so it will ultimately cost the parish \$35,000-\$40,000. Donations are needed and appreciated.

Both the choir loft project and \$2.5 million belltower project are ongoing. The Grateful for God's Mercies (GFGM) capital campaign is projected to raise nearly \$1.5 million. The funds have provided our Cathedral with an updated sanctuary and new tabernacle, new boilers, roof repair for the Baraga chapel, AC for the parish office, and partially paid for the sewer pipe repair and north rectory basement wall waterproofing. Thank you for your donations in support of this important and necessary work. 




St. Mary Mission History, cont'd from Aug. 17th:

The first wedding at Birch was between Henry Asselin and Addie Riley on Aug. 9, 1907. Father Sauriol listed L. J. McBrady and F. Loiron as witnesses.

Later evidence shows that Fr. Sauriol went further into the area of Big Bay where he baptized Francis Burns, son of Charles Burns and Maggie LeClerc, on Aug. 29, 1907.

In addition to Fr. Sauriol, the name of Msgr. J.B. Moriarity attests to baptisms in the Birch-Big Bay communities in 1908.

Meanwhile, activities at Birch began to slow down and the people moved to Big Bay where lumbering was making strides. In 1912 there were about 50 Catholic families who were attended to very infrequently by the clergy until the appearance of Phil Aird, Sr. To be continued...


