FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings and Salutations!

Happy 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time! Here is some information about upcoming faith formation opportunities at St. Peter Cathedral.

On **Sept 7th**, Faith Formation registration forms are due. There will be a cookout after

10:30am Mass sponsored by the K of C. **Sept 21st** is the first day of class for all age groups. Regular faith formation classes for grades 1-8 are Sunday mornings from 9:00-10:15am. For High School, the Upper Room gatherings will be held on Sunday evenings from 6:00-7:30 pm.

For adults seeking to become Catholic, classes begin on Thursday, **October 16th** at 7:00 pm. It is known as the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults, or **OCIA**. If you are interested, or you know someone who is, please contact me at boman@stpetercathedral.org.

On **November 13th**, we will host the theologian, Dr. Daniel Keating, PhD. Dr. Keating is Professor of Theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary where he teaches on the Church Fathers, Ecumenism, and the New Evangelization. Dr. Keating will offer a presentation on the writings of the early Church Fathers concerning the Eucharist. Trust me when I say, we are in for a real treat. The evening will begin at 6pm with dinner and the talk will be at 7pm. The parish will provide the main course:

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." Luke 14:1, 7-14

The reason the air conditioning hasn't been on is that the 100-ton chiller catastrophically failed. The HVAC engineer from our insurance company recently concluded that a lightning strike caused the damage. The cost to replace the chiller is estimated to be in the range of \$145,000-\$150,000. Our insurance will cover roughly 76% of the replacement cost, so it will ultimately cost the parish \$35,000-\$40,000. Monetary gifts are needed and appreciated.





St. Mary Mission History, cont'd from Aug. 24th:

Fr. Jodacy kept his promise and sometime in May, 1912, he arrived on the train. He, Phil Aird, and August Rohl obtained lumber and built a temporary altar which they carried upstairs above the company store in the same building which is the present Big Bay Hotel and held Sunday Mass. According to Letitia Chaperone (nee Aird), the altar and a confessional bench were removed to their home after Mass where the priest would say another Mass on Monday before he left on the train for Marquette. Father Jodacy even arranged in July of 1912 for Father Corcoran and two Sisters from St. John's to spend a week in Big Bay to prepare the children for a First Communion Class, among them were the Aird girls.

More responsible service was provided by Bishop Eis between 1912 and 1915 when the Cathedral Parish rendered several priests to serve the Big Bay community. A priest came once a month where Mass continued above the store, the School House, then later in the Town Hall, now referred to as "The Teacherage." Mrs. Aird and Mrs. Jim Madigan would go on Saturdays and clothe the portable altar in bed sheets and cover a corner for a confessional. To be continued....


