





Greetings and Salutations!

Happy 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time!

In October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates *Respect Life Month*, and the first Sunday of October is designated as *Respect Life Sunday*. To mark the beginning of this month, SPCs High

School Youth Ministry will host a Holy Hour on Sunday, **October 5th beginning with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 6:15pm**. Praise and worship music will be featured. Come and thank God for the gift of life!

For adults seeking to become Catholic, classes begin on Thursday, **October 16th** at 7:00 pm. It is known as the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults, or **OCIA**. If you are interested, or you know someone who is, please contact me at boman@stpetercathedral.org.

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus said to the Pharisees:

"There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

St. Mary Mission History, cont'd from Sept. 21st:

The church between 1923 and 1930 was attended to by priests listed in the Family Tree. With the exception of Father Waechter, most were assistants from the Cathedral. Father Waechter was attached to the Chaplaincy of St. Mary's Hospital.

When Fr. Zryd came in August 1930, Mass was said every two weeks. He was the first priest to say Mass every week. Under his guidance and much discussion a basement was erected under the church providing accommodations to serve as a social center and instruction area for the children. The Ladies Altar Society inaugurated hunter suppers, picnics, card parties and bake sales under the direction of Mrs. Philip Aird, Sr., and Mrs. A. J. Fleury, to warrant putting in the basement. Mr. Fagan of Marquette completed the task at a cost of \$2,256. The Church now had a new roof, a splendid hall and a new furnace, all completed in 1940. Prior to this the heat was supplied by a large barrel-like stove that sat up in the right front part of the church. Msgr. Zryd referred to it as Big Bertha. It was fired up every Sunday by Phil Aird to keep the people warm in the winter months. To be continued....






