FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings and Salutations!

Happy Feast Day! As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, we are drawn into the quiet mystery of Nazareth, where Jesus spent most of His earthly life. Saint Paul VI reminds us that

Nazareth is not just a place, but a school—a school of the Gospel, where we learn through the everyday experiences of silence, family, and work. “The hidden life of Nazareth allows every person to be in communion with Jesus along the most ordinary paths of everyday life. Nazareth is the school in which we begin to understand the life of Jesus, that is, the school of the Gospel...In the first place, may it teach us silence. May there return to us an appreciation of this stupendous and indispensable spiritual condition, deafened as we are by so much tumult, so much noise, so many voices of our chaotic and frenzied modern life. O silence of Nazareth, teach us recollection, reflection, and eagerness to heed the good inspirations and words of true teachers; teach us the need and value of preparation, of study, of meditation, of interior life, of secret prayer seen by God alone...

Nazareth reminds us what the family is, what communion of love is, its austere and simple beauty, its sacred and inviolable character...Finally, let us learn a lesson of work. Oh! House of Nazareth, home of the “Carpenter’s Son”! Here, we especially want to understand how to praise the severe but redeeming law of human labor...We want to greet workers throughout the world and show them their great model, their Divine Brother” (Saint Pope Paul VI, discourse of 5 January 1964).

Save the Dates and looking ahead: The schedule for the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God is Dec 31—5:30pm Vigil; January 1—9:00am & 11:00am. At St. Mary Mission, the Vigil Mass is at 5:30pm on Dec 31.

To thank God for the gift of life and to pray for a conversion of hearts and an end to abortion, on January 22nd, we will host “All Day Adoration” in the Main Church, 8:30am to 6pm ending with benediction. A sign-up sheet is on the bulletin board.

On February 7th, we will be hosting a pre-Lenten party at 5:30pm: “Beat the Chill Chili Cookoff and Chiller Fundraiser.” That’s a lot of “chill.” A sign-up sheet for chili entries is in the gathering space. Our defunct AC chiller is scheduled to be replaced this spring, and we aim to raise \$45,000 to cover expenses not met by insurance.

Whether you’re a chili connoisseur or simply love to sample, everyone is welcome. Bring your family and friends for an evening of delicious competition, warm fellowship, and great fun. Every dollar raised will help to ensure our Cathedral stays at a heaven-like temperature and not the contrary!



Litany of the Holy Name of Jesus


Join Dr. Ben Akers and Taylor Kemp as we celebrate the feast of The Most Holy Name of Jesus with this litany prayer of the Holy Name.




