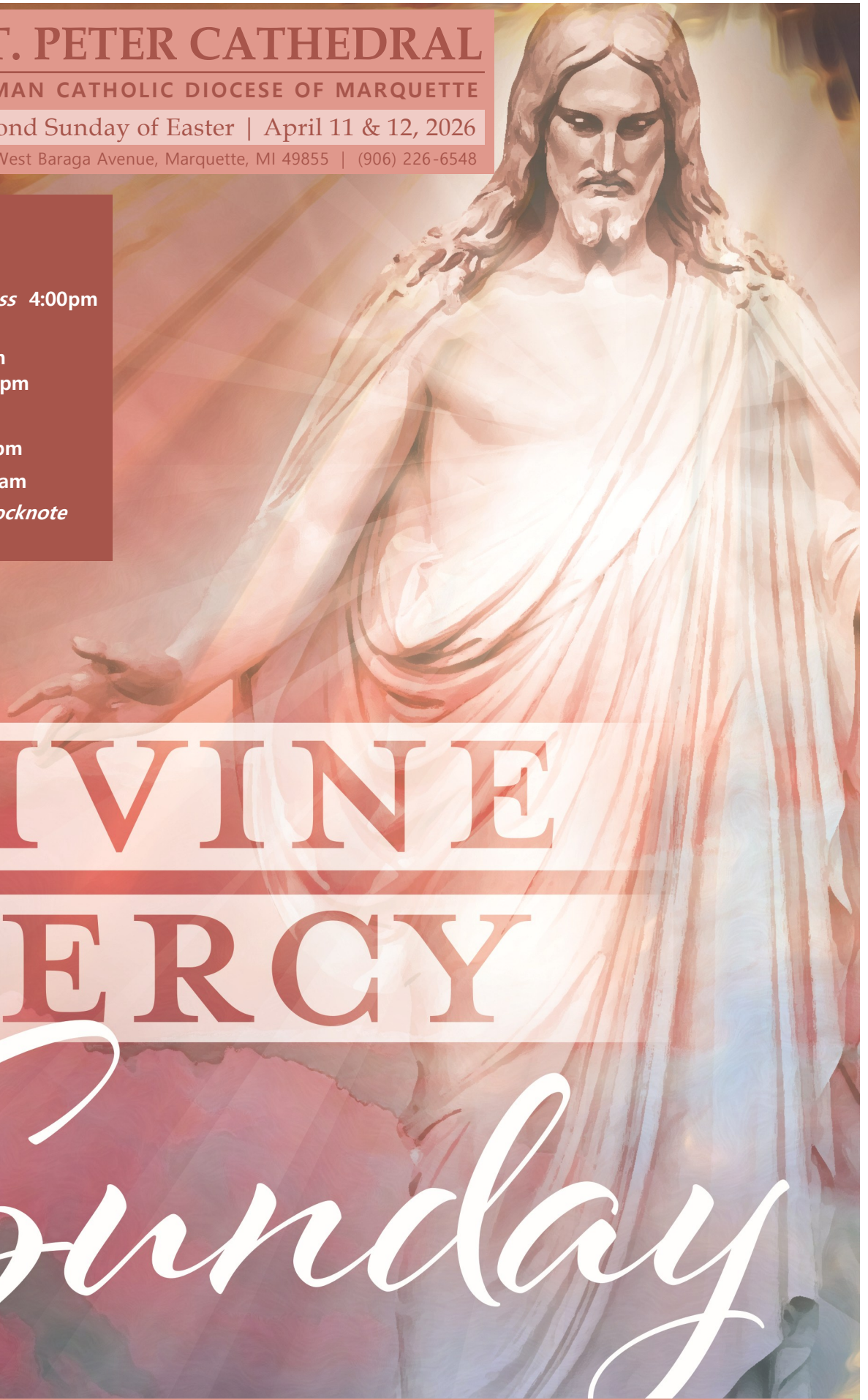

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings and Salutations! Happy 2nd Sunday of Easter, also known as the Sunday of Divine Mercy. Why? It's because a central element of the Gospel for this Sunday centers on the Risen Lord giving his Apostles the power to forgive sins.

St. John writes that "On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:19-23). Jesus is waiting for you in the Sacrament of Reconciliation!

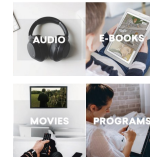
Beginning at 2:30pm on Sunday afternoon, we will host the devotions of Divine Mercy Sunday. Included in the order of celebration are Adoration, Confession, the Rosary, and the Divine Mercy chaplet. Additionally, there are indulgences attached to Divine Mercy devotions. A *plenary indulgence*, is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession within 20 days, Eucharistic communion within 20 days and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the *Our Father* and the *Creed*, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!); A *partial indulgence*, is granted to the faithful who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation. *For those who cannot go to church or the seriously ill...* may obtain a plenary indulgence on Divine Mercy Sunday, if totally detesting any sin, as has been said before, and with the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three usual conditions, will recite the *Our Father* and the *Creed* before a devout image of Our Merciful Lord Jesus and, in addition, pray a devout invocation to the Merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you).

Save the Dates: The annual procession for Corpus Christi follows the 10:30am Mass on June 7th. Our annual parish festival on our patronal feast—the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul—is Sunday, June 28th after the 10:30am Mass. Invite your friends!

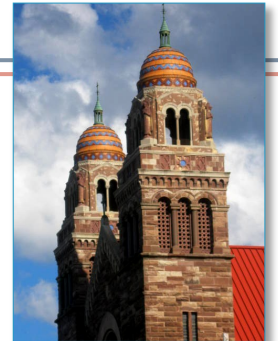

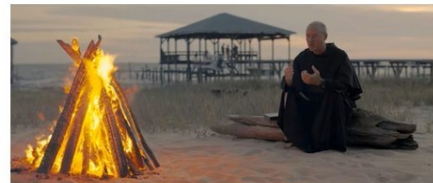
The Vatican has granted a Plenary Indulgence to all who participate in the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday.

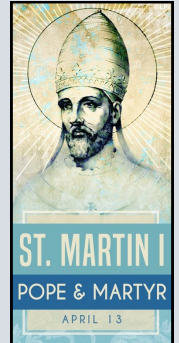

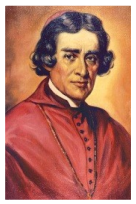

Lessons from the Catechism of the Council of Trent:

The Lord's Prayer

In the first place, the necessity of prayer should be insisted upon. Prayer is a duty not only recommended by way of counsel, but also commanded by obligatory precept. Christ the Lord declared this when He said: *We should pray always.* (Luke 18:1). This necessity of prayer the church points out in the prelude, if we may so call it, which she prefixes to the Lord's Prayer: *Admonished by salutary precepts, and taught by divine instruction, we presume to say, etc.*

Therefore, since prayer is necessary to the Christian, the Son of God, yielding to the request of the disciples, *Lord, teach us to pray* (Luke 11:1), gave them a prescribed form of prayer, and encouraged them to hope that the objects of their petitions would be granted. He Himself was to them a model of prayer; He not only prayed assiduously, but watched whole nights in prayer. (Luke 6:12)

The Apostles, also, did not omit to recommend this duty to those who had been converted to the faith of Jesus Christ. (1 Pet. 3:7; 4:7)

This form of Christian prayer, The Lord's Prayer, was given to us by Jesus Christ. It is composed and arranged so that before coming to requests and petitions certain words must be used as a sort of preface calculated to increase our confidence in God when we are about to address Him devoutly in prayer; so that the faithful may have recourse to prayer more readily because of the knowledge that they are going to commune and converse with a God who is also their Father.
