



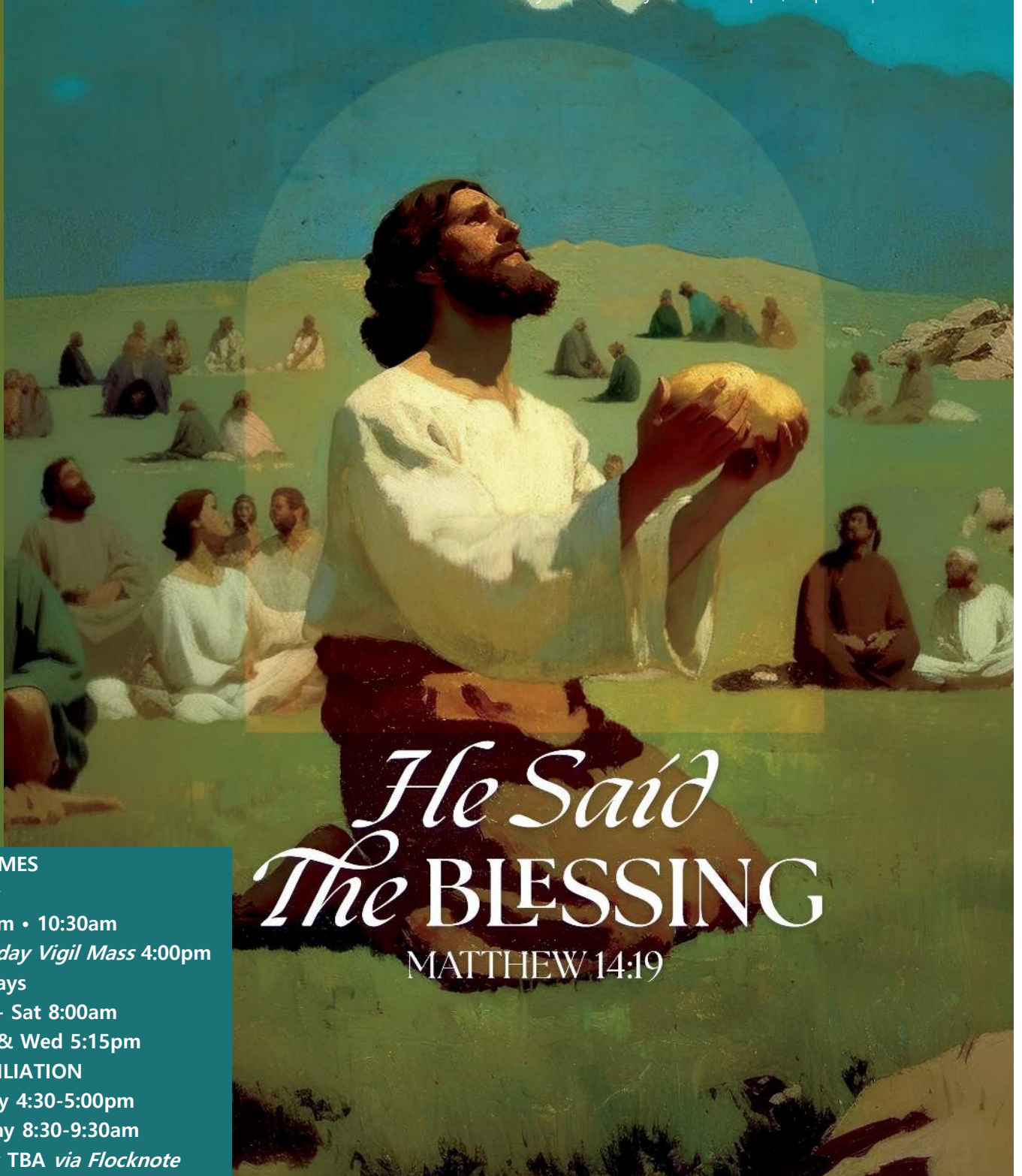

Greetings and Salutations!
Happy 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time!

In the Gospel for this Sunday—Matthew 14:13-21—the crowds followed Jesus into a deserted place because they sensed that He alone could satisfy the deepest hunger of the human heart. There, they discovered an important lesson: before the good Lord multiplied the loaves, He first allowed the people to become hungry. God often works the same way in our lives. At times He permits us to experience emptiness, disappointment, loneliness, spiritual dryness, or unmet desires—not to abandon us, but to teach us where true fulfillment is found.



We naturally try to satisfy our hunger with success, possessions, comfort, or distraction, yet these things can never fill the heart. Only Christ can. As St. Teresa of Ávila wisely wrote, "Let nothing disturb you... God alone suffices." When we discover that Jesus Himself is enough, every other blessing finds its proper place. May we bring our deepest hunger to Him this Sunday, trusting that He will satisfy us with the Bread of Life.

St. Alphonsus Liguori | Catholic Saints

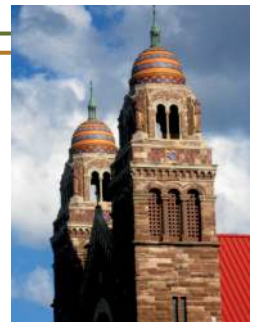

Lessons from the Catechism of the Council of Trent: "Amen"

The word *amen*, with which the Lord's Prayer concludes, contains, as it were, the germs of many of these thoughts and reflections which we have just considered. Indeed, so frequent was this Hebrew word in the mouth of the Saviour, that it pleased the Holy Ghost to have it retained in the Church of God. Its meaning may be said to be: *Know that thy prayers are heard.* It has the force of a response, as if God answers the suppliant and graciously dismisses him, after having favorably heard his prayers.

To us also this word is very appropriate, containing, as it does, some confirmation of the Petitions which we have already offered up. It also fixes our attention when we are engaged in holy prayer; for it frequently happens that in prayer a variety of distracting thoughts divert the mind to other objects.

Nay, more, by this word we most earnestly beg of God that all our preceding Petitions may be granted; or rather, understanding that they have been all granted,

and feeling the divine assistance powerfully present with us, we cry out together with the Prophet; *Behold God is my helper; and the Lord is the protector of my soul.* (Ps.53:6)

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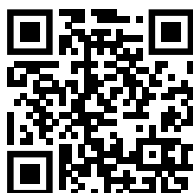
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
