



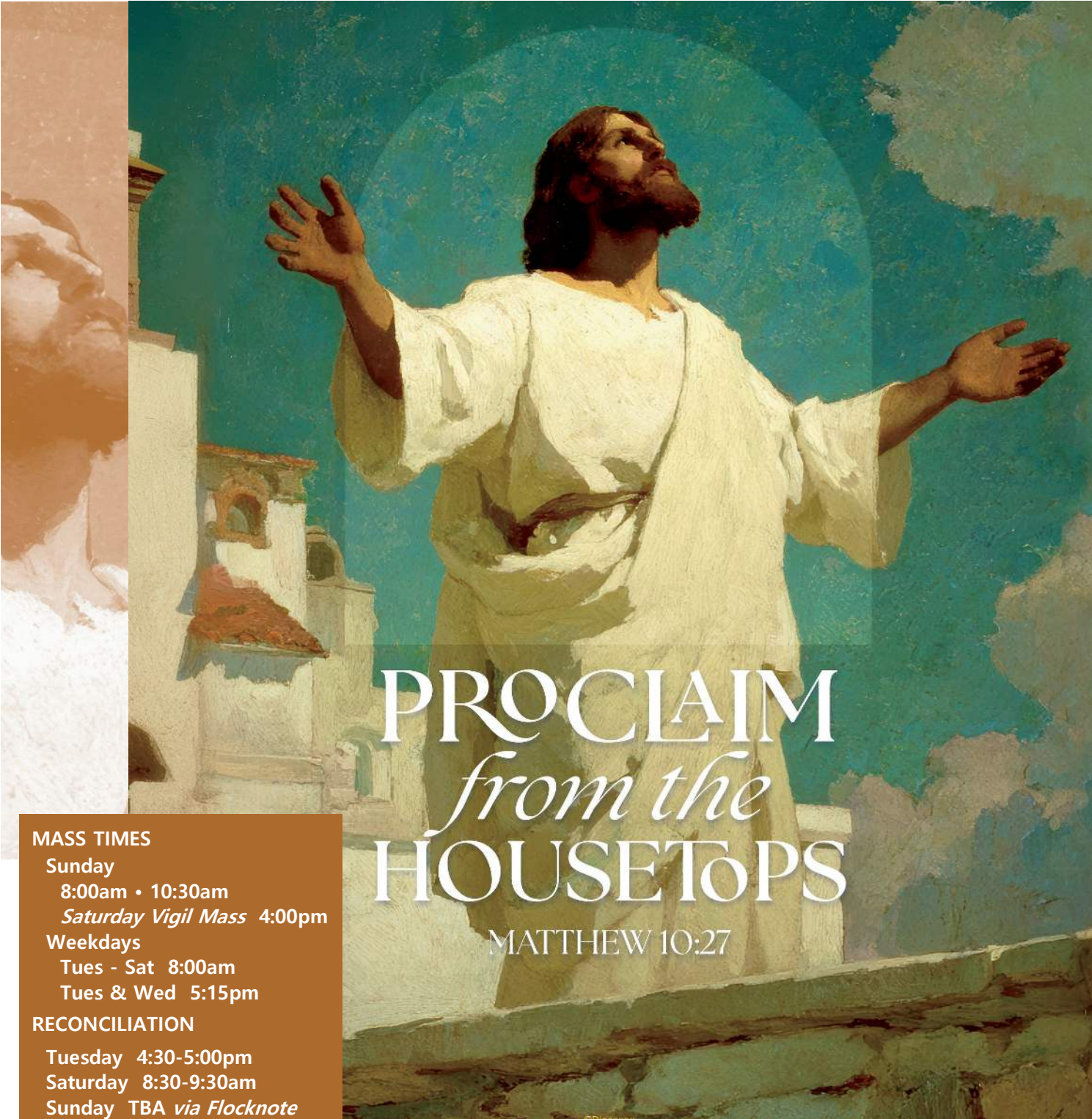

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings and Salutations! Happy 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time!

Our annual **Parish Festival** on our patronal feast—the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul—is Sunday, June 28th after the 10:30am Mass. If you would like to bring a dish to pass, please sign up on the bulletin board. The festival will

be in the courtyard and will feature grilled meats, beer, music and games.

Mysteries and Messengers: Two priests from the Order of Preachers, the **Dominicans**, will offer a mission at St. Peter Cathedral from **July 19-21**. The mission priests will begin with Confessions w/Adoration at 5:00-6:15pm, followed by their evening conference at 6:30pm on the theme of Mary as Queen of Angels.

Dear Friends at St. Peter Cathedral,

I hope this finds you well and that your summer is off to a tremendous start. My name is Fr. James Pierce Cavanaugh, OP. I am a Dominican priest and the Promoter of the Holy Rosary for the Midwestern United States. I am based in Chicago, though I've spent a good portion of the year on the road; this summer I am blessed to be coming to you.

I will be traveling with one of my brothers in the Order, Fr. Adrian Patrick McCaffery, a priest and professor of Philosophy at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas — the Angelicum — in Rome. Together, we will be preaching and presenting on a theme that sits at the very heart of our Dominican heritage: Mary as Queen of the Angels.

Everything we will do is rightly oriented around the Blessed Lord and his Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament. The full picture of what we offer is best appreciated in that context: the Rosary, given to the Church through Saint Dominic and the Dominican Order, is not merely a devotional habit. It is a contemplative instrument pointed directly toward Jesus in the Eucharist and the angels in their glory, who serve his presence in a particular and profound way, also point toward Him. That is the heart of our preaching.

We can promise you this: you have not heard this presented before. And you will have every opportunity through our time together to deepen your encounter with the Rosary, with Jesus, and with our Blessed Mother who leads us to him. We wish you every blessing and look forward very much to being with you.

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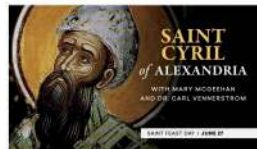
Saint Thomas More: The Age of the Author

St. Cyril of Alexandria | Catholic Saints

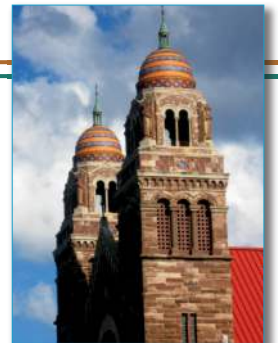

Lessons from the Catechism of the Council of Trent: *(Last time we discussed our daily bread, this week we focus on our debts.)*

The Lord's Prayer: "And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors." There are those who, aware that they ought to bury injuries in voluntary oblivion and ought to love those that injure them, desire to do so and do so as far as they are able, but feel that they cannot efface from their mind all recollection of injuries. For there lurk in the mind some remains of private grudge, in consequence of which such persons are disturbed by misgivings of conscience, fearing that they have not in simplicity and frankness laid aside their enmities and consequently do not obey the command of God.

Here, therefore, the pastor should explain the contrary desires of the flesh and of the spirit; that the former is prone to revenge, the latter ready to pardon; that hence a continual struggle and conflict goes on between them. Wherefore he should point out that although the appetites of corrupt nature are ever opposing and rebelling against reason, we are not on this account to be uneasy regarding salvation, provided the spirit perseveres in the duty and disposition of forgiving injuries and of loving our neighbor.

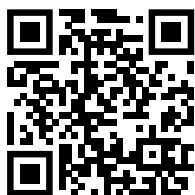
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
