



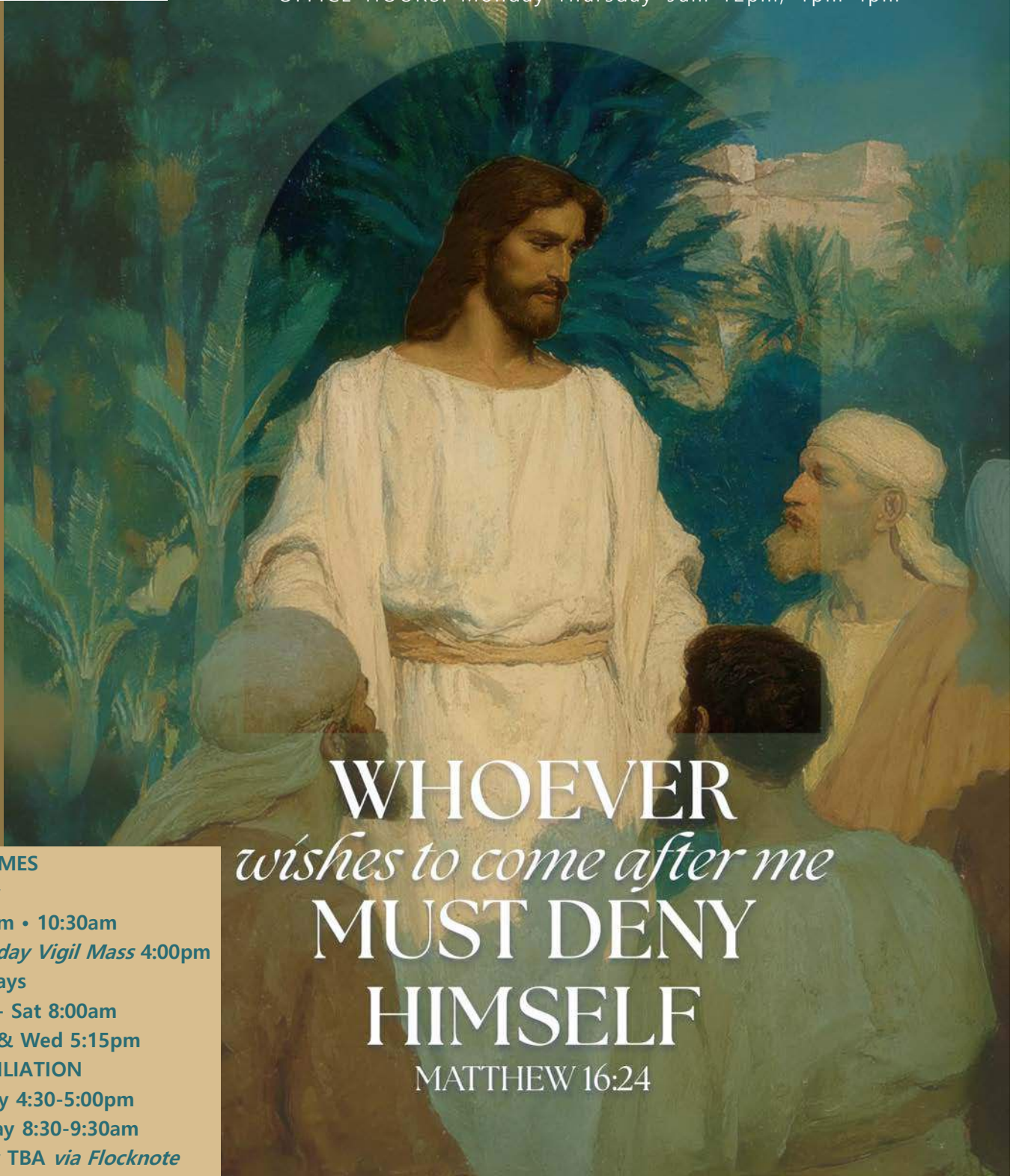

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Happy 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time! I just returned from USAF training. Please continue to pray for our Airmen.

A final repeat of our bell tower restoration, in case anyone has missed a recent bulletin!

Bell Tower Restoration Project Update

Our bell tower restoration is progressing very well. The project is focused primarily on the uppermost 40 feet of the tower. This section was added after the devastating fire of 1935.

The materials used in that section reflect the building practices of the time. Unlike the lower portions of the Cathedral, the upper tower is not constructed primarily of sandstone. Instead, it consists largely of structural brick covered with a veneer of terra-cotta block that was glazed or painted to resemble sandstone. The dome and angels are also made of colored, glazed terra-cotta.

One of the most significant aspects of the project has been the extensive restoration of the load-bearing masonry. Years of water intrusion, combined with repeated freeze-and-thaw cycles, caused severe deterioration of the brick. For lack of a better word, much of it had become "rotten." The deteriorated brick has been carefully removed and replaced with concrete masonry units.

This has been a painstaking process. The old brick must be removed and replaced in small sections so that the structural integrity of the tower is maintained throughout the work. Our architect remarked that, had this deterioration continued unchecked, we were perhaps only five years away from reaching a "point of no return." That gives some perspective on just how necessary this project has been.

Along with stabilizing the structure, extensive waterproofing has been completed using modern materials and techniques. Large cracks that had allowed water to penetrate the load-bearing masonry have been repaired. The decorative and functional limestone sills and friezes—which had been pushed, shifted, and displaced by water and ice—have also been repaired and sealed.

The team of masons and bricklayers is now working on the tuckpointing of the tower, a good sign that the project is beginning to wind down. Paint is also being carefully mixed and matched so that the terra-cotta can once again be finished to resemble the Cathedral's sandstone. That work will begin soon.

In addition to the bell tower, another important repair is underway on the gable above the main entrance. The finial, or apex stone, supporting the beautiful copper cross had cracked because of water infiltration and had become dislodged. The limestone sill stones running along the top of the triangular gable had also cracked, shifted, and begun shedding pieces of stone.

I personally witnessed pressure being applied to the pipe supporting the cross, and I can tell you that it would not have taken much force to bring that entire section down. Thankfully, we discovered the problem in time, and that portion of the Cathedral is being repaired as well.

There is still work to be done, but we are getting close. This project is not simply cosmetic. It is preserving the structural integrity, beauty, and safety of our Cathedral so that it may continue to serve generations to come.

Time flies! Aug 1st marked my two-year anniversary as your pastor. For 12 weeks, beginning sometime this Fall, I will be on a mission for the USAF. I cannot give any more details than that. Please know that you will be in good hands with Fr. Zachary and that I have been working for the last 2 years to ensure both parishes will run smoothly when I'm away. —————>
